#### Article I

## INTRODUCTION AND ORGANIZATION

The faculty of the Larner College of Medicine includes all professors, associate professors, assistant professors, faculty scientists, clinical practice physicians, and instructorsadarted and volunteer pathways of the rnerCollegeof Medicine The faculty is further subdivided into departments, each administered by partment Chair. ### Article V

## DEPARTMENT ORGANIZATION

<u>Section 1</u>. Duties of Academic DepartmentsDepartments are administrative units charged with implementation of the educational, research, and clinical programs of the Larner College of Medicine. Formal recognition of a department requires approval of the Dean, the LCOM faculty, the Provost and theoard of Trustees.

The Dean shall meet with each department chair at least annually to review the department report and cademic activities. Additionally, basicience and clinical departments shall be periodically reviewed comprehensively reviewed to university's policies and procedures as found in the University Officers Manual

<u>Section 2</u>. Jurisdiction. Each department has jurisdiction over matters that concern primarily its own internal polices if those policies are consistent with the policies of the Larner College of Medicine and University.

<u>Section 2</u>. Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) Committee. The CQI Committee provides oversight for ongoing quality improvement processes in support of our medical education mission. This includes, but is not limited to, issues related to the Liaison Committee on Medical Education accreditation standards and elements. The purpose is to monitor and improve, in real-time, educational program quality and ensure the medical education program's compliance with accreditation standards. As appropriate, this process will address areas of the Strategic Plan that require monitoring or improvement.

The Committee's work includes, however is not limited to: determining which issues and accreditation elements are monitored, how often monitoring occurs, which individuals/groups receive and review the results, and the process, accountability, and tifaelineroving identified issues. The Committee works closely with, and does not duplicate, the work or authority of the Medical Curriculum Committee.

## **AMENDMENTS**

<u>Section 1</u> The Bylaws of the Faculty of the Collegnay be amended at any regular meeting of the faculty by two-thirds vote of a membership quorum as defined in Article detion 3 above. Written notice of any amendment and the subject matter thereof must be given in the notification of the meeting at which it is to be considered.

Section 2. The Bylaws of the Faculty of the Larner College Medicinemay be amended by an electronic ballot of the faculty providing that two of the members voting vote in favor of the amendment, and ose the salaried faculty return a ballot by the due date. Written notification of the amendment is to be provided no less than two erect (21) calendar days before the close of balloting.

<u>Section 3</u>. These Bylaws of the Faculty of the Larner College of Medi**aine**to be reviewed for revisions a minimum of every eighears. At such time, the Dean will convened thoc committee of faculty to review and propose revisions that are to be voted on at a duly warned meeting of the Larner College of Medicifaeculty.
