programs and record levels of research funding (of the 70 Carnegie research universities with 15,000 or fewer students, UVM is one of only three publics to rank in the top 20 in research expenditures); leadership of the successful Campaign for the University of Vermont (exceeded the \$250 million goal by more than \$28 million); founder and inaugural director of the University of Vermont Foundation; support of negotiated faculty contracts that achieved, among other things, annual salary pools averaging slightly above 5% per year for nine straight years; significant campus expansion (by 1.2 million square feet, or 27%), including major land acquisitions and new academic buildings, residence halls, and a new student union (all LEED Certified at the Gold level); enhanced intellectual life of the campus with new lecture series (Burack Lecture Series) and resident faculty program (James Marsh Professorial); invigorated intercollegiate athletics with nationally competitive teams and annual academic cup awards in conference (seven years running). Increased directed federal appropriations from 15th nationally among colleges and universities in 2003 to 20th in 2007. Enhanced national presence and visibility

of UVM by establishing a voice through opinion pieces in the national press and media (the Washington Post, the Chicago Tribune, National Public Radio, the PBS Newshour with Jim Lehrer), keynote addresses at national and regional professional meetings, and

Faculty personnel. Reviewed and made recommendations on all university promotion and tenure cases; supervised work and presided over meetings of campus faculty promotion and tenure review committee.

Diversity, affirmative action. Spearheaded a variety of programs that boosted enrollment of degree-seeking African American graduate students from 126 in the fall of 1991 to 314 in the fall of 1997, including 28 African American doctoral candidates in chemistry (the
