## Requirements of a Cost-Sharing State Plan Amendment (SPA)

In order for a state to have an SPA there are a number of requirements. There must be an identification of populations that can be affected and a decision as to which services the state will assign cost-sharing programs. <sup>10</sup> There must be an affirmation that the plan properly excludes all exempt services and populations, and an explanation of the tracking and monitoring process. The final requirement is an assurance that appropriate advanced public notice is
