

Maintaining academic integrity is essential to the mission of the Exam Proctoring Center and the University of Vermont. All students are required to adhere to all University of Vermont student codes and policies, including the [Code of Academic Integrity](#), while testing at the EPC.

The University of Vermont's Code of Academic Integrity defines academic dishonesty as "Failure to abide by the four standards of academic integrity stated in this Code (plagiarism, collusion, cheating, and fabrication)."

At emptying to leave or successfully leaving the EPC with exam materials including:

- Exam document(s)
- Any EPC-issued lined or scrap paper (all used and blank sheets must be turned in at EPC \$ tiller it CE check out)
- Notes written on the body
- Note cards and sheets (if faculty have not permitted return to student)

Technology misuse during testing including:

- Browsing unapproved online materials (i.e., Google, Wikipedia, ChatGPT, etc.)
- Use of unapproved tech devices including cell phones

At emptying to leave or successfully leaving the EPC without checking out at the EPC Front Desk for a break or upon exam completion.

If an incident of academic dishonesty is observed or suspected by EPC staff, EPC staff will make every effort to speak with the student as it occurs and interrupt the behavior when possible. EPC staff will speak with the student in a private setting away from other students and will inform the student of their observations, request that the student discontinue the observed behavior, remind the student of their duty to report their observations to the instructor and the Center for Student Integrity (CE InsBro
