Interdisciplinary:Senior Thesis Pathways



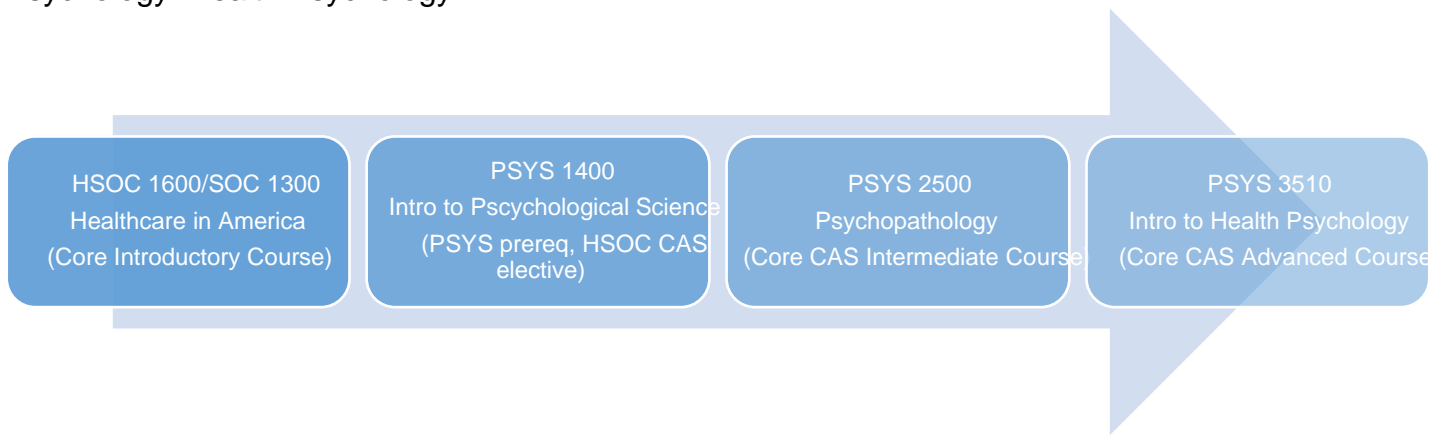

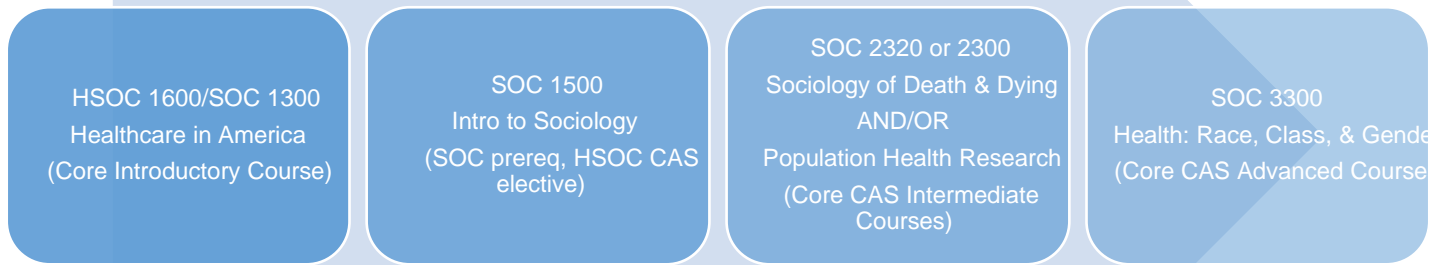


