


### British Hop Association

- Ø Formed in 1996 to create a co-ordinated approach for the industry and in particular the research and development of new hop varieties through its subsiduary Wye Hops
- Ø Wye Hops-Headed by Ali Capper and Dr Peter Darby
  - Ø 1998 ì 13 commercial varieties
  - Ø Today Ì 31 commercial varieties
- Ø BHA represented by two directors from each producer group
  - ø English Hops Limited
  - Ø Hawkbrand Limited
  - Ø Wealden Limited
- Ø BHA represents the hop industry to UK government, the EU and international hop commitees

## Growing Area

#### 50 Growers

- Ø 55% grown in the South East
- Ø 45% grown in the West Midland



# Selling English Hops

- ø Merchants
  - Ø Steiner Hops
  - Ø Barth Haas
  - Ø Charles faram
  - ø Lupofresh
- Ø Majority sold through producer group to Merchant
- Ø Growing volume sold from grower group to brewery
- Ø Small amount sold direct grower to brewery

### Growing Hops in England Wirework

Vast majority on tall wirework

- ø 12-18ft tall
- Ø 6-12ft row space
- ø 3-6ft plant space

Hop Poles

- Creosoted slow grown soft wood from Scandinavia
- ø Farm grown chestnut

On our farm

- Ø 8/9ft row space. 4ft plant space, 16.5ft tall wirework
- Ø This gives 1366 plants per acre
- Ø 20% of English Hops are grown on dwarf/ low trellis wirework
- Ø Apologies I have limited knowledge on this!




